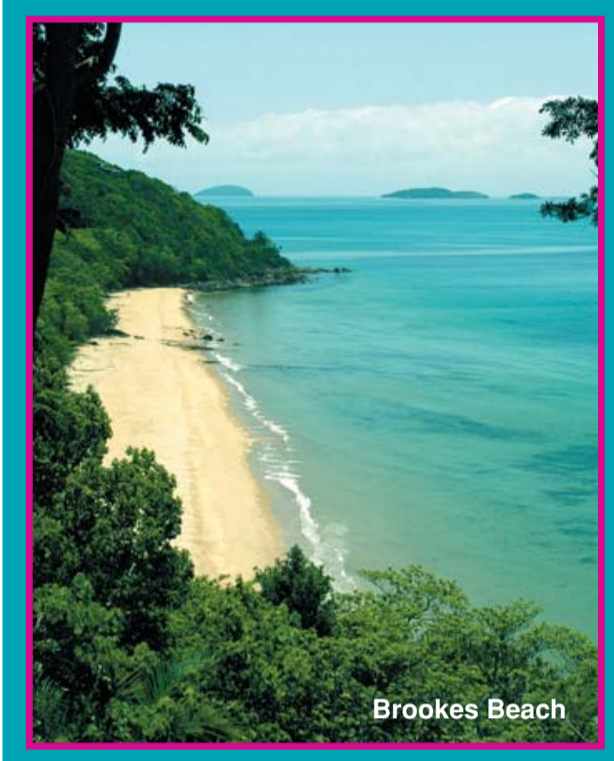




# MISSION BEACH - DUNK ISLAND

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Mission Beach's coastline comprises 24 km of golden, sandy beaches & cool green rainforest with many islands dotting the horizon and many bush walks within the national parks, state forests or World Heritage areas. The twelve islands of the Family Group and the Great Barrier Reef are within easy access by boat. Dunk Island, the father of the group is also accessible by ferry, water taxi or jet ski.

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## INNISFAIL

Where Rivers and Nations Meet

A Town Heritage Walk has been compiled and more information can be obtained from the Canecutter Way Visitor Centre (4061 4361) or Innisfail Information Centre (4063 2655)

An important component of the Wet Tropics World Heritage Area, **Wooroonoan** boasts some of the oldest surviving rainforest in the world. Walking tracks include:

- €Crawford's Lookout to North Johnstone River Lookout (1.5kms) - the track winds down, dropping some 500m. There is access to river via a steep 800m walk from junction.
- €Crawford's Lookout along Highway to the entrance to Tchupala Falls (2kms).
- €From here the track leads either to Tchupala Falls or to spectacular Wallicher Falls
- €Continue to Goolagan's Ck Picnic Area (3kms).

€From Goolagan's Creek Picnic Area a short track (800m) then follows Henrietta Creek and links the picnic and camping areas.

€From here, the track climbs the ridge that separates Henrietta and Douglas Creeks. It then winds slowly down towards Nandroya Falls (2kms) from the camping area. Return back along the main Nandroya Falls track or continue along the full circuit track (7.2km). It then skirts a steep hillside before rejoining the main track about 1km from the camping area.

Camping permits can be obtained from the self-registration station at the camping area.

## The 'Boulders' Wildland Park

19km one way to Goldborough Valley. Walk for half an hour or more, then turn back. This very pretty stroll along the river will entrance you.

EXTREME DANGER  
Do not enter the water downstream of this point for any reason

FOR YOUR SAFETY  
Babinda Creek has claimed many lives. KEEP TO WALKING TRACKS.  
Only 8 kilometres from the Babinda turnoff beneath the foothills of Mt. Bartle Frere, lie the beautiful Boulders which is the starting point for several excellent bushwalks. These include: Devil's Pool Walk to the Boulders Lookout (100m); Devil's Pool Lookout (470m) and onto Boulders Gorge Lookout (600m).

## Bartle Frere Summit Trail

Wooroonoan National Park

At 1622 metres, Mt. Bartle Frere is Queensland's highest peak. Distance to the Summit is approximately 7.5 kilometres. The trail is unformed and very steep in some places. Keep to marked trail as it is easy to get lost in dense rainforest. Access to the trail is at the turnoff to Josephine Falls (2 kilometres south of Miriwinni) on the Bruce Highway. The park entrance is 8 kilometres from the turnoff. From the parking area you will make a steep gradual climb coming to Big Rock Camp. You can either climb to spectacular Broken Nose or continue, to pass over numerous granite boulders, and on to the Summit. From the Summit, you can return to your starting point or continue to the other side (15 kilometres total length).

The trail descends to Top Western Camp and North West Peak. The next 5 kilometres is a steep descent. When Bobbin Bobbin Falls can be heard, the exit is only 2 kilometres away. A camping permit is required & is available from self-registration stands at the trail ends. Only the fittest bushwalkers can cover this distance in one day so the hike is best undertaken over 2 days.

SAFETY FOR HIKERS  
Before departing for this hike please ensure you:-

- seek local info from Ranger Station;
- have correct maps and compass;
- have adequate food, water, clothing suitable for wet & cold conditions;
- give details of proposed trip to a responsible person;
- take a fuel stove, no fires permitted.
